#1: Nisha Patel & Carlon Harris - The strong resumes, CVs, and cover letters session allowed Mentees to review samples of strong templates and formats and learn how to effectively align their resume with job postings. Mentees were also given the opportunity to submit their resumes to the mentors for their review.

#2: Dr. Josephine Banks & Sana Imam - The interview preparation and salary negotiations session reviewed common behavioral and technical interview questions with interview tips, a pre and post interview checklist, and offer letter and salary negotiation tips. Mentees were introduced to the key aspects of an offer package and the different offer stages.

#3: Chad Collins & LaKisha Mack - This career specific session provided a clear understanding of Academic Medical Centers, the different career avenues in Academic Medicine and the skills needed. LaKisha and Chad provided valuable insight from their own personal career journey and relationships built along the way.

#4: Sana Imam - The consulting session provided the fundamentals of healthcare consulting, the skills needed to prepare for a career in consulting, and the top health care challenges consultants are assisting clients with in today's climate. Sana also engaged the mentees with Case Study examples.

#5: Tina Malik - The health care finance session provided the primary goals of finance in health care and 10 major goals of health care finance leaders. Mentees walked away with a better understanding of the importance of finance in health care and how finance leaders partner with operations.
